

## **COVID Protocol as of January 2022**

### **What is close contact exposure?**

Exposure (or being in close contact) is defined as being within 6 feet of someone for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period.

### **What does fully vaccinated mean?**

A fully vaccinated person is someone who has received either:

- 2 doses of Pfizer or Moderna within the last 6 months (and at least 2 weeks have passed since the second shot) OR
- 1 dose of the Johnson and Johnson vaccine within the last 2 months OR
- someone who has received the booster shot

### **What if a Peachtree Presbyterian Preschool student or teacher has a close contact exposure to someone with COVID-19**

\* Anyone Unvaccinated or Not Fully Vaccinated: (meaning it has been over 6 months out from you receiving Pfizer or Moderna vaccines or over 2 months out from you receiving a J&J without a booster)

- Student and household members should not come to campus
- Contact the school nurse, Caitlin Barnhart

- Student can return on the 6<sup>th</sup> day with the date of last exposure to the positive person being day 0 under the following circumstances;
  1. With a negative PCR test administered no earlier than day 5
  2. No symptoms
  3. Wear a well-fitting mask days 6 to 10 while on campus (student must be able to competently wear a mask)
- Due to mask criteria for 6<sup>th</sup> day return, toddlers and young twos will not be eligible to return on day 6 after exposure.
- Instead, toddlers and young twos students can return on the 10<sup>th</sup> day with the date of last exposure to the positive person being day 0 under the following circumstances (assuming no symptoms).

- Unvaccinated household members (including siblings) are cleared to return to campus when the exposed family member is cleared to return.
- Students and household members who are fully vaccinated/ boosted, if eligible (with vaccination record on file) or have had Covid-19 within the last 3 months (confirmed by a positive viral test) do not need to quarantine, but should monitor for symptoms.

\* Fully Vaccinated and Boosted, if eligible: (Pfizer or Moderna within 6 months, J&J within 2 months, and boosted, if eligible)

  - Not required to quarantine
  - Wear a mask for 10 days following exposure
  - PCR test no earlier than 5 days after the exposure and submit results
  - Make sure vaccination record is on file
  - Monitor for symptoms for 14 days
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- Individuals who have tested positive for Covid-19 within the last 3 months do not need to quarantine or test, but should monitor for symptoms for 14 days

### **What if a Peachtree Presbyterian Preschool student or teacher tests Positive for COVID-19?**

- Positive individual and household members (including siblings) should not come to campus.
- Contact school nurse, Caitlin Barnhart

- Individual who tested positive should remain home for 5 days following positive test and can return to school on day 6. The following criteria must be met to return on day 6
  1. Asymptomatic or
  2. Symptoms resolved for at least 3 days
  3. Mask must be worn to school days 6 through 10
- Toddlers and young twos must isolate for 10 days because they cannot wear a mask effectively

- Unvaccinated household members (including siblings) are cleared to return to campus when the exposed family member is cleared to return.
- Fully vaccinated household members do not need to quarantine and should monitor for symptoms for 14 days.
